

SECTION 3146 2012 SHIRAZ

Joachim Zerk, an early German pioneer farmer, settled in the Barossa Valley in 1846. He then purchased for 200 pounds what he considered a perfect site for a vineyard, which was named 'SECTION 3146'.

The Zerk vineyard (where sisters Janelle and Kristen grew up together) is situated in Lyndoch in the Barossa Valley and is steeped deep in family history. This wine captures the essence of the vineyard and five generations of pioneering hard work from 1846 (over 160 years).

This wine is always made from exemplary Shiraz, displaying the robust nature of the Barossa Valley at its best. Beautiful raspberry fruit characters, red licorice, perfume and notes of black pepper and spice with complimentary toasty oak, chocolate tannins and an earthy savouriness make this a superb wine for all occasions.

We recommend this elegant yet rich Shiraz to be enjoyed with aged vintage cheeses or an eye fillet with a red wine reduction. Decant to reap your reward!
